Wineries

Look out for these wines:

<u>Marisco</u> King's Series & The Ned: one of New Zealand's top wineries. By happy coincidence Andy Matthews' brother-in-law Brent Marris, is the award-winning winemaker & proprietor together with Andy's sister – no nepotism here!

Consider a visit to the West Coast wineries.

Bars

If you are after a bar near Sky City two good picks are <u>Bellota</u> or <u>Federal</u> (which unfortunately does not take bookings).

Things To Do

Wander around the **harbour** in the inner city. Visit <u>Britomart</u> precinct and the **Viaduct** area. The **Maritime Museum** is definitely worth a stop if you have the time.

For a slightly longer stroll you can keep walking towards the **Wynyard Wharf** including the city fish market and as far on as **Westhaven Marina** and **Harbour Bridge**. This definitely embodies the "City of Sails".

Visit the **Auckland War Memorial Museum** for stunning city views and take in a cultural show. 15 minutes by cab from the CBD.

Visit **Mission Bay** or **St Helier's Bay**, 20 minutes from the CBD. These are some of Auckland's most popular "Bays"- suburbs by the beach.

A trip out to the wild **West Coast beaches** is well worth considering on a free half or full day. Combine this with a visit to the local wineries.

If the weather is kind take a trip out to **Waiheke Island**. A 45-minute ferry from downtown and a jewel in Auckland's crown. A mix of fine dining, artisan and laid back life.
